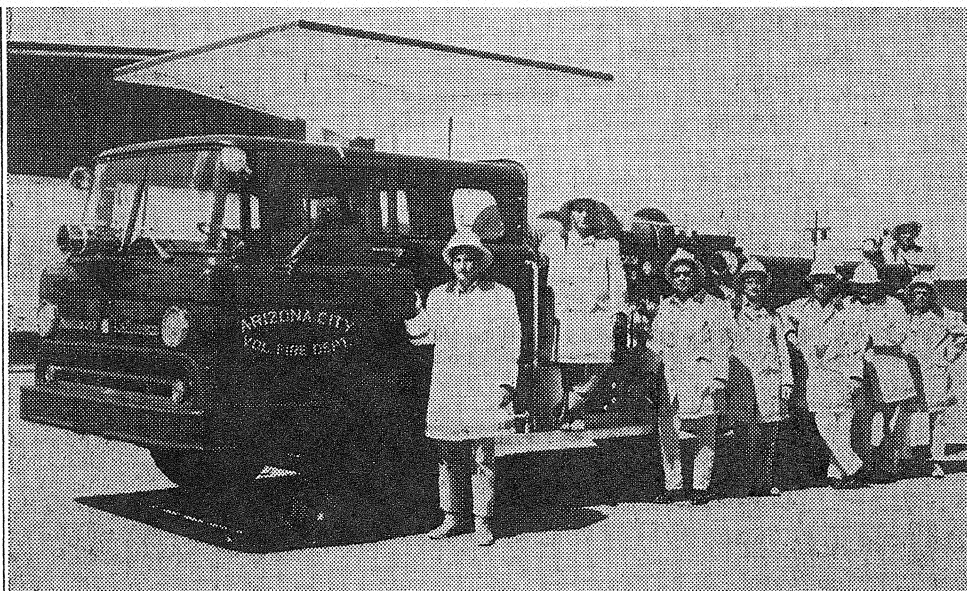

New Pumper truck, plus additional fire plugs, equals insurance savings

Arizona City is working toward getting lower fire insurance rates through acquisition of its new American LaFrance custom-built pumper truck, according to Francis Brown, chief of the Arizona City Volunteer Fire department.

Together with the Arizona City Development Corp. installa-

tion of additional fire plugs, but they told us it would be totaling 23, the new fire truck is expected to bring a reduction in insurance rates.

"We should have a new fire rating by the end of this year," Brown said. The fire department chief explained that it might take as long as nine months to get an inspection team from the fire underwriters here.

The new \$23,700 truck, acquired on a lease-purchase arrangement over a 6-year period, will mean no higher tax rate, the fire chief assured residents.

The department's original pumper truck will be used as standby equipment, Brown said.
